Alhumdulill-h, we have completed another year at Muhammadi Madrasah. It has been a year of developments, adjustments and achievements. Although I have been a member of the Muhammadi Madrasah staff team for several years and have always been proud to be one, the past 8 months in the role of Principal and the experiences that have come with it have been significantly momentous. The formation of the Madrasah Board in December 2016 is another development that will go towards fulfilling one of my objectives to involve parents and community members in the future of the Madrasah. Other achievements in 2016 have paved the way for 2017 to have amazing potential for elevating our students learning and experiences, such as the upgraded Islamic Studies Syllabus throughout both the Primary and Secondary ages, and also the new Qur'an Syllabus for the Primary students. I am also continuing my commitments to enhancing our staff with skills and experience that will aid them both in the classroom and in their personal lives. A new staff enrichment programme is almost ready to roll out where staff will be offered free professional training. I strongly believe that a teaching team who are appreciated and trusted fully will have the ability to unlock the true potential of each of our students. For this reason, Muhammadi Madrasah staff were acknowledged for their efforts at an end of year staff event in December 2016, it was a wonderful evening.

This year, together with the new Deputy Principal Br. MohammedAbbas Jivraj, I intend to continue committing to my objectives that are all focussed around bringing the Madrasah back into the forefront of the Community. Our children are our future community and so we must give them the very best opportunities today. This can include an exemplary education, trained and talented teachers, sustained support on an Islamic and secular level but most of all the feeling that they are loved and that they belong.

I am so overwhelmed by the support I have received from the parents, community members and also the various committees that make up the KSIMC of Birmingham. For this support and encouragement I will always be grateful.
