STRENGTHENING OUR RELATIONSHIPS

During 2017/18, The World Federation reached out to many global organisations to help build our network and increase the impact of our work.

IRAQ

Last year, the Office Bearers team travelled to Iraq to visit senior Marajas and spiritual leaders from the Shia Ithna Asheri community.

The team sought special counsel from his Eminence Al-Sayyid Ali Al-Husseini Al-Sistani on various religious and social issues, including a code of leadership, interaction with other communities and advice for The World Federation Leadership team.

SYRIA & LEBANON

The World Federation last year announced a new partnership with an international aid agency, Iraqi Red Crescent Society (IRCS), which led to the opening of our co-ordination unit in Damascus.

We also strengthened our relationship with the Imam Al-Sadr Foundation in Lebanon, which the Office Bearers team visited last year and witnessed the impact of our collaborated humanitarian work.





AFRICA

The World Federation President attended the Africa Federation Supreme Council Session in Nairobi, Kenya, in July 2017, where he was given an update on housing projects and higher education schemes.

He also visited Madagascar to explore a school project in collaboration with Antananarivo Jamaat, as the standards of education in Government schools are poor.

EUROPE

London, Birmingham and Peterborough hosted The World Federation President, where he directly addressed the jamaats and was given key updates.

He went on to attend a Councillors meeting in Leicester to discuss community matters and also, during his UK visit, he chaired the second Executive Council meeting, where he listened to the views of the community.

NORTH AMERICA

A new agreement was signed between NASIMCO and The World Federation that will share resource to improve humanitarian relief and Madrasah education.

Training has already rolled out for Madrasah teacher training and the feedback we have received has been exceptionally positive.

ZERO% ADMIN POLICY

The World Federation announced a Zero% Admin Policy in January 2018 so donors can be reassured their valuable donations are being used on charitable projects.

Like every charitable organisation, there are essential costs that need funding so we can continue with our benevolent work. These costs are now being covered by projected income from our Foundation Fund (see opposite) and through Gift Aid, a UK tax rebate scheme.

A final resolution was passed and adopted by the Executive Council at the Triennial Conference, held in May 2017, with the following statement: 'It is hereby resolved that the administration fee charged by The World Federation on donations to projects and appeals run by The World Federation or its members or constituent members be reduced to 0% with effect from 1st January 2018'.

Our strive for efficiency means, as well as our Zero% Policy, we have created a strong platform for self-sustainability and growth of the organisation.





FOUNDATION FUND

A key objective of The World Federation is to ensure its own growth and sustainability as an organisation, so it can continue to have a positive impact around the world through community-centred projects.

To help achieve this, a Foundation Fund was set-up in 2010, with the primary aim of generating sufficient income from capital invested to cover the indirect and infrastructure costs of the organisation.

The principle of the Foundation Fund stems from the concept of 'Waqf', an Islamic tradition where land, buildings or money is donated, and the profits are used to support charitable causes.

There are still additional pledges to be collected for the Foundation Fund and suitable investment opportunities are continually being pursued by the Trustees to expand the portfolio.


Khums is a religious obligation for Shia Muslims, which is compulsory (wajib). "Khums" literally means "one-fifth", and in Islamic law it refers to a religious tax which is payable on a number of things, the most common of which is your profit from earnings.

Every year, you must pay one-fifth of your earnings after subtracting your expenses. This payment is your Khums for the year.

The Khums payment is split into two equal parts. One half is given to the Imam (A) of the time; this is called "sahme imam" (the portion for the Imam (A)). In the absence of the Imam (A), this part must either be given to a marja' taqlid (i.e. a high religious authority who can be followed in matters of Islamic law), or it must be spent on purposes that he authorises. The other portion is given to sayyids (i.e. descendants of the Prophet (S)) who are poor, orphans or stranded travellers; this is called "sahme sadat" (the portion for sayyids). Khums can also be paid to those individuals or organisations who have been given permission (ijaza) to collect it.

The World Federation is proud to have received permission from His Eminence al-Sayyid al-Sistani to collect Khums payments on his behalf and to disperse the sahme imam part on religious projects, such as our fantastic children's education and teacher training programmes.







If you've never fulfilled this religious obligation before or need a reminder about some of the details, we can help guide you through what's eligible, why we pay it, when to start, who to pay and where it goes.

You can also download our Khums app on the Google and Apple app stores, which will instantaneously help you calculate your Khums liabilities, set reminders for the future and take payments to fulfil this beautiful and benevolent obligation, Alhamdulillah.







KHOJA HERITAGE PROJECT

The aim of the Khoja Heritage Project (KHP) is to promote and preserve the legacy and heritage of the Khoja Shia Ithna Asheri Community, whilst creating a sense of appreciation for the incredible legacy of the founding members of this Community.

PROMOTING KHOJA HISTORY

Shaykh Kumail Rajani, Deputy Chair of KHP, spoke to the Senior Citizens in Birmingham last August about the Khoja Heritage Project.

ANCIENT TEXTS

The Khoja Heritage Project, in association with Mulla Asger Resource Centre (MARC), has successfully catalogued more than 85 rare texts on the community history curated at MARC. The titles unfold the community history of late nineteenth century colonial India.

KHOJAPEDIA

An evolving, comprehensive and growing online resource that has over 2,500 entries, including Khoja personalities.

ONLINE

The KHP Team introduced an interactive online course in April 2018 called Khoja Studies Course. The sessions, presented by Dr Hasnain Walji, chair of KHP, will help participants understand Khoja history, where it started and important accomplishments of the Khoja heritage.

KHOJA NEWS

To strengthen our community integration and increase our growing digital presence, we are developing an exclusive news portal site that will share the latest community-related news.



THE KHOJA HERITAGE TOUR

The KHP team held its first ever Khoja Heritage Tour this year, which gave senior citizens the opportunity to visit key locations in India that are significant to our community.

The exciting 16-day tour started off in Mumbai and continued to Bhuj, Kera, Mandvi, Dhordo, Mundra, Nagalpur, Lalpur, Jamnagar, Amreli, Mahuva, Bhavnagar and Ahmedabad.

The group were taught about each place's history and significance to the Khoja community.

This Khoja Heritage Tour was a huge achievement for the Khoja Heritage Project team, who have been working tirelessly to ensure our community history and heritage is preserved and celebrated.

FATIMA INSPIRES

Our annual Fatima Inspires initiative recognises and celebrates inspiring women from across our community in honour of the Lady of Light, Sayyida Fatima (sa).

Sayyida Fatima Zahra (sa) was given the title of Sayyidatu Nisa al A'lameen by the Holy Prophet (saw) as she was the best of all the women of the world and the perfect role model for both men and women. This year, we received a record-breaking number of nominations, which made shortlisting incredibly difficult.

This important programme helps bring incredible women to the forefront of our community by celebrating their achievements and volunteer work.

SUPPORTING STUDENT EDUCATION

One of our goals at The World Federation is to enable growth and progress through education, to create a generation who will work together to improve their communities.

HIRIDJEE FOUNDATION LOAN

This year, two female students from the Khoja community were granted the Hiridjee loan. The loan, which amounts to £10,000 per student, is awarded for a maximum of three consecutive years to help students with university tuition and/or accommodation.

You're helping students like Zaynab. She is from Dar es Salaam and is pursuing an MBBS; a five-and-a-half-year course at Kasturba Medical College Manipal University, India. When she graduates, her aim is to alleviate the suffering of people through medical treatment.

IBRAHIM JAFFER IBRAHIM LOAN

The Ibrahim Jaffer Ibrahim loan was launched in collaboration with Africa Federation for students looking to study a bachelor's degree but unable to afford the cost. Two female students were granted USD 15,000 per annum for a maximum of four consecutive years.

WALJI-PARDHAN LOAN

The Walji Alibhai Pradhan loan was set up several years ago to enable Khoja undergraduates to pursue higher education. As a result of loan repayments from previous students, we were able to provide a new loan of £4,749 to fund one new student.



HEALTHY LIVING



We launched the Healthy Living campaign to tackle the growing problems we all face to stay healthy, especially during the winter months.

We provided community members with some ideas on how they could easily add more steps into their daily routine, from taking the stairs instead of the lift, to long family walks exploring parks or new cities!

For those who wanted to be more committed, we introduced the 10,000 Steps Challenge, led by own very own health and lifestyle guru, Dr Mahmood Mawjee.

10,000 STEPS CHALLENGE



Our community health initiative, 10,000 Steps Challenge, focused on improving general lifestyle by walking towards 10,000 steps a day!

Introducing more exercise into our daily routine has been proven to reduce stress, fatigue and pains, whilst also improving both our physical and mental well-being and overall fitness.



REAL TALK

In preparation for the Second Executive Council (ExCo), which took place February 2018 in London, The World Federation Office Bearers and Regional leadership teams provided an opportunity to hear directly from community members about topics important to them and our community.

The event began with several speeches from senior leaders from the UK and Africa. Awards were presented to commendable individuals for their contributions to the community.

The main part of the evening was the Real Talk event, held in partnership with Stanmore Jafferys Literary, which provided an opportunity for the community to have their questions answered directly by The World Federation leadership team.

The World Federation Secretary General, Shan E Abbas Hassam, added:

"These sorts of events are exactly what we at The World Federation, want to be doing more of. We want to connect with our grassroots members and engage with them through open dialogue. It allows us to answer their questions and for them to have a voice to tell us what they want and expect from us."



MADRASAH CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE

Madrasah Centre of Excellence

The Madrasah Centre of Excellence (MCE) has now been in existence for over five years and provides a central global structure for madaris to seek help and support in the running of their institutions. Thanks to the support of our regional bodies, in the last year we have achieved key milestones with Teacher Skills Programmes (TSP), Neuro Psychology of Learning (NPL) and Micro Teach being rolled out to participating madaris worldwide.

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

Our curriculum aims to give the best Islamic education for future generations by following in the footsteps of the Ahlul Bayt (AS), as well as instilling in them the values of the Holy Quran, which will help them fulfil an Islamic lifestyle.

We are working towards and have nearly created: 500 teaching guides, 380 lessons, 120 story books, 120 workbooks.

CREATING MILESTONES

The MCE team achieved huge milestones in Australia and North America with the introduction of the Teacher Skills Programme, which was hosted in these countries for the first time.



TEACHER DEVELOPMENT

MCE, in association with regional bodies, carries out a variety of training programmes to equip teachers with the necessary skills to teach the Tarbiyah Curriculum. Today, we have trained around 2,150 teachers across three different types of course:

NEUROPSYCHOLOGY OF LEARNING PROGRAMME

A self-assessment of the psychological elements involved in learning and reviewing the learning needs for different students.

TEACHER SKILLS PROGRAMME

Covers key areas of training, including responsibilities of a madrasah teacher, planning skills, inclusive learning and reflective practice.

TARBIYAH TRAINING

Teachers will practice delivering a class structured around the Tarbiyah curriculum to children and other teachers.



TABLEEGH

The World Federation promotes the teachings of the Ahlul Bayt (as) through workshops, youth camps and Islamic courses across the world.

EAST AFRICA

For the 8th consecutive year, the Bilal Muslim Mission, in collaboration with The World Federation, organised a 10 day workshop attended by 136 participants in Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, Rwanda, and Burundi.

TRINIDAD & TOBAGO

During December 2017, an Islamic studies short course conducted in Granada by Shaykh Dr. Mohammad Zakaria gave 20 attendees an overview of the principles of worship.

NEPAL, KATHMANDU

A Resident Alim attended to the spiritual needs of 13 refugee families living in Nepal and the team hired a building to help facilitate internal and external Tableegh in the country.

BOSNIA

To help promote the Shia Ithna-Asheri faith in Bosnia, The World Federation distributed 1,000 translated copies of the book Towards Eternal Life by Shaykh Bahmanpour during 2017/18. The books helped community members to understand the concept of life after death and were distributed to libraries, madaris and cultural centres.

SOWETO, SOUTH AFRICA

The World Federation sponsored special programmes which were held during the last 10 nights of Muharram in the Soweto Ahlul Bait Jamaat, South Africa. The programmes increased awareness about Muharram amongst community members and helped spread the valuable teachings left behind by Imam Hussain (as).



YOUTH CAMPS IN INDIA



Two youth camps were held for 31 boys and 31 girls. The camps promoted Islamic values and principles, addressed socially relevant topics like hero worship and facilitated personal development through games and activities.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

In April 2017, in partnership with India Federation, The World Federation held a two-day event for youth members at Haji Nazarali Imambargah, Kurla.

YOUTH GROUP DISCUSSIONS

In June 2017, 50 participants joined an evening interaction and informal session with an Alim, covering subjects including motivational topics, social responsibility and religious discourses.

MENTOR TRAINING

14 participants attended a Mentors Training Programme in Mumbai. The core focus of this programme was to create an in-depth understanding of mentoring, mentor-mentee relationships and the values of life.

WORKSHOP ON KHUMS

The World Federation's India Office organised two workshops aimed at creating awareness and increasing understanding of Khums. During 2017, over 50 participants attended the workshops, which covered topics like the importance of Khums, applicability of Khums today and distribution.

SHIA WILLS

The World Federation partnered with Africa Federation and The Council of European Jamaats to develop an online service that facilitates the writing of wills, known as Shia Wills.

The purpose of this project is to assist Shia Ithna-Asheri Muslims in the creation of wills that adhere to the rulings of Ayatullah al-Sayyid al-Sistani and every year, shiawills.org helps thousands of people to complete their wills in just five minutes.

HOUSING

The World Federation believes access to secure adequate housing is the foundation block, so a family can focus, worry-free, on education, earning a living and living a healthy life.

BHAVNAGAR HOUSING PROJECT

The World Federation identified 32 families in Bhavnagar, India, who were in desperate need of adequate housing.

Our appeal helped towards the construction of a new apartment block and contributed towards rent, helping families to afford monthly payments.

ALASGHERY RESIDENCY

With the help from Councillor Ahmed Daya, we pioneered a fantastic scheme called "Rent-to-Own", which enables families to live in affordable housing in Dar-Es-Salaam.

We helped build 18 apartments for families, who, with the help of AFED, have now been allocated.

KARBALA IRAQ

The World Federation supports a housing project in Iraq for victims of civil war.

Working with the Al Ayn Foundation, the housing project is situated outside the holy city of Karbala and will look to be a home for 100 families.



HUJJAT SCHEME

There are many young couples and families who can sustain monthly mortgage payments, however, struggle to raise the necessary deposit to secure a mortgage.

This led to the creation of The Hujjat Housing Scheme, which allows newlyweds and families in the Stanmore area of London, UK, to apply for a deposit loan from COEJ.



UBER

Many young professionals and new graduates with degrees struggle to get work in India and unemployment rates are increasing.

Our innovative Drive for Change programme provides cars for young drivers in India and Pakistan, so they can start their own taxi business through Uber, Ola, Careem or other online services.

Six cars were provided last year, helping six families in India. One of our beneficiaries is Ali, who received a car and is now able to provide for his family and have job security, enabling him to save for the future.

ECONOMIC UPLIFTMENT

The Economic Upliftment Loan scheme started in 2014 as a way for The World Federation to help people living in impoverished areas to set-up or boost their business.

This scheme helps individuals create an income for themselves and their families with a special focus around the concept of saving.

Working closely with Africa Federation (AFED), The World Federation sponsored 23 deserving individuals and helped to change their lives.

Provision of these small loans allows hardworking community members to help kick-start their independent business through the purchase of essentials like a Rickshaw, small scale production line or animals for farming.

WF-AID EMERGENCY APPEALS

WF-AID have teams on the ground who are responding to emergencies around the world.

SYRIA

The brutal fighting in Syria rages on and the country has now entered its eighth year of conflict, leaving 6.5 million driven out of their homes.

Lady Zaynab Helping Hands Syria Appeal

WF-AID - in partnership with Iraqi Red Crescent Society - opened a co-ordination unit in Damascus, which is helping to provide aid to displaced widows, orphans and families escaping the conflict.

With valuable donations received through the Lady Zaynab Helpings Hands Syria Appeal, WF-AID has been supporting thousands of people with food baskets, educational support and medical interventions.

ROHINGYA APPEAL

In August 2017, violence broke out between opposing groups in Myanmar, which prompted a wave of deadly violence against the Rohingya people.

WF-AID responded to the crisis by launching an emergency campaign in September 2017. Through our partners on the ground, WF-AID distributed food packs and hygiene kits to around 13,758 internally displaced people who lost their homes.

WF-AID also distributed food rations to 600 vulnerable people from Myanmar who had endured the treacherous journey into Cox's Bazaar, Bangladesh.
